On behalf of the officers of the Hallsville Police Department, I wanted to take a moment to thank the Hallsville community for the outstanding support our department has received. The HPD's mission is to preserve public safety and quality of life within the City of

Hallsville, to respond effectively to the changing needs of the community, and to promote mutual respect between the Police Department and the people we serve. From the officers on patrol to the officers in our schools.



The City of Hallsville has hired a new Police Officer named Cody Schmitz. Officer Schmitz has been a member of the Missouri Army National Guard since 2008 and has 6 years of law enforcement experience. Officer Schmitz's primary duty will be acting School Resource Officer (SRO) for the Hallsville School District.

The HPD has recently started a Facebook page, Hallsville Missouri Police Department. You may have read of several recent arrests made by HPD and cannot be blamed for thinking that there has been a spike in crime. The truth is, the work that HPD does for the community has always remained consistent. The addition to the Facebook page has allowed us to better inform the public of the work that we do on your behalf.

A reminder for those parents who take their children to school. The west side entry drive of the Intermediate School drop off/pick up parking lot will be a NO LEFT TURN at the beginning of the school year. There will be a new sign in place near the entrance. Enforcement of this signage WILL be enforced. All drop off/pick up traffic must come from the east side of the school parking lot. This is an ongoing effort to control the traffic flow on a narrow road that was not built for the amount of traffic it now sees. Your cooperation also ensures that we keep a lane of travel open for emergency responders to quickly transit through the area.

Lastly, I am very proud of the work that the Police Foundation of Hallsville has been able to do and has planned to do in the future. The Foundation recently donated bleachers and concrete to Tribble Park by the ballfields. We are currently working on a project to get Hallsville relit for Christmas, a youth fishing event this year or the next (stay tuned!), other upcoming youth activities, and our yearly #PinkPatchProject Cancer Fundraiser. The Hallsville Park Board has experienced many changes over the last year. Members have left and new members have joined. The City would like to extend our gratitude to Dan McCaleb & Missi McCaleb (a pervious Park Board Chairperson), Steven Durk & Alaina Durk (another previous Park Board Chairperson) and Kena Forbis for their service. The new members include Trynton Roberts, the new Chairman, and Tom Payne. Laura Moss has been on the Park Board since 2016. Park Volunteers are Heather Schultz, Kenyetta Ridgway-Sample, and Katie Sexton. The Park Board is a nine citizen board. You can pick up an application at City Hall if you would like to join. To be a voting Board Member you just need to live in the city limits of Hallsville.

The Park Board has been working on an updated 5 year plan that was approved by the Board of Aldermen on June 14, 2021.

They are close to completing FY 2020-2021. The two new spring bounce animals were ordered and have arrived, the bleachers donated by the Police Foundation of Hallsville have been installed, and the merry-go-round was removed to be sandblasted and powder coated. Public Works will be removing the bulletin board and park sign on Rte B.

FY 2020-2021

- * Remove and replace the two spring bounce animals.
- Install donated bleachers.
- Sandblast & powder coat merry-go-round
- Remove bulletin board at park.
- Remove Park sign on Route B.

FY 2021-2022

- Remove & replace bathrooms.
- Add mulch if needed.
- Add gravel to trail if needed.
- Purchase two to three park benches
- Repairs to basketball court if needed.
- Add second baseball field or soccer field.
- Another set of bleachers

FY 2022-2023

- Remove wooden play structure.
- New piece of equipment

FY 2023-2024

Repair or replace tennis court.

FY 2024-2025

- Add climbing structure and other miscellaneous playground equipment.
- Install splash pad.

Then it will be on to FY 2021-2022 improvements! The Park Board is checking on another movie in the park this year along with their 'Trick or Treat' in the Park! Hopefully, this year we can go back to the traditional event!

Unfortunately, if you simply Google "Hallsville Water Payments" you may get a vendor that is NOT AUTHORIZED by the City of Hallsville. While the vendor may be a legit business, they are NOT AUTHORIZED by the City of Hallsville & usually charge you additional fees.

We have disconnected service due to non- payment by said companies. Please use caution when making your payment online.

Starting July 16, 2021, there will be a convenience fee charged on all credit/debit card transactions when you pay online, over the phone, or in person at City Hall. The fee is 2.75% or a minimum of \$2.75. You can still pay with cash, check, or a money order. You can also sign up for automatic withdrawal through the City for no fee.

Water/Sewer Disconnections in the City of Hallsville

Water bills are due by the 10th of each month. A 5% late fee is assessed on the 11th. If your account is not paid by the 20th there will be a \$35.00 nonpayment fee assessed and service will be subject to disconnection. A charge of \$25.00 is added to turn your water back on.

The first time you fail to pay you will receive a letter from City Hall advising of the charges and disconnection ordinance.

Pet tags are renewed in August of each year. An additional fee of \$25.00 is added at the time the license exceeds 60 days past one year. (on October 31st) The City

of Hallsville requires a license for all dogs & cats over the age of 6 months. Owners must show proof of rabies vaccination and pay of fee of \$3.00/year for pets spayed/neutered and \$5.00/year for pets not spayed/neutered.

RECYCLING BIN INFORMATION



You do not need to use any bags when using the recycling bin at the Community Center.

They expect all material in the dumpster to be recyclable. Please keep in mind that plastic bags are not recyclable, so they encourage using a cardboard box or reusable plastic tub to help transport your material to the bin location. If you decide that plastic bags are more convenient, at this time you can still throw the bag of recycled material in the bin.

Littering citations are still being issued for leaving recyclable items and/or trash on the ground around the bin. If the bin is full, please do not leave your recycling outside of the recycling bin.
