Another reminder: Where to vote on November 4th!

This special election is only for voters in the Hallsville area, who will see ballot issues from the City of Hallsville and Hallsville R-IV School District. Polling places, the Hallsville Baptist Church on Elizabeth and Missouri National Guard HQ, as well as the Boone County Government Center will be available for voting on Election Day.

Proposition U

Shall the City of Hallsville impose a local use tax at the same rate as the total local sales tax rate, provided that if the local sales tax rate is reduced or raised by voter approval, the local use tax rate shall also be reduced or raised by the same action?

A Use Tax Funds Community Services & Generates Local Revenue. It Is NOT A Double Tax!

Online shopping has gained significant prominence in recent years, resulting in a steady decline in in-store shopping. Nationwide, online sales surged by 30% during the pandemic and, as of 2023, accounted for over 15.4% of total retail sales.

In light of the growth of e-commerce, the City is experiencing a decline in sales tax revenue. To adapt to this shift, it is imperative for the City to modernize its revenue sources to ensure the continued provision of essential services.

The City heavily depends on local sales tax revenues to fund fundamental services, such as parks, community center upkeep, Historical Society utilities, road maintenance, vehicle and equipment maintenance and upgrades, and public works. However, due to the absence of a use tax, Hallsville has incurred an estimated loss of approximately \$400,000 in tax revenue attributable to online shopping over the past five years.

November 2025

- November 4th: Special Election polling at Hallsville Baptist Church from 6:00 a.m. until 7:00 p.m.
- November 5th: Emergency sirens are tested the first Wednesday of every month at noon.
- November 10th: Accounts signed up for automatic withdraw payments for City water and/or trash will have payments removed from your checking account.
- November 11th: City Hall will be closed to observe Veterans Day.
- November 12th: A 5% penalty is added to all water and/or trash accounts that are unpaid.
- **November 17th:** The Board of Aldermen will have their regular monthly meeting at 7:00 p.m. in City Hall a week later than normally scheduled.
- November 24th: A \$35 nonpayment fee will be added to all water and/or trash accounts that are unpaid. Services will be discontinued. Needing help with your bill? Call City Hall before the 21st to make a payment arrangement. (If the 21st is a Friday, water is normally not shut until Monday)
- November 26th & November 27th: City Hall will be closed for the Thanksgiving Holiday.
