- **September 1st:** City Hall will be closed in observance of Labor Day.
- September 3rd: Emergency sirens are tested the first Wednesday of every month at noon.
- September 8th: The Board of Aldermen have their regular monthly meeting at 7:00 p.m. in City Hall.
- **September 10th:** Accounts signed up for automatic withdraw payments for City water and/or trash will have payments removed from your checking account.
- September 11th: A 5% penalty is added to all water and/or trash accounts that are unpaid.
- September 17th and September 18th: City Hall will be closed from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. for training. The office will be open from 4:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. on those two days.
- September 22nd: A \$35 nonpayment fee will be added to all water and/or trash accounts that are unpaid. Services will be discontinued. Needing help with your bill? Call City Hall before the 21st to make a payment arrangement.

Why Communities Vote Yes For A Use Tax

This November 4th, residents will have the opportunity to vote on a local use tax again. A use tax is a sales tax that applies to online purchases made from out-of-state retailers when sales tax is not already collected. In short: if you buy something at a local store, you pay sales tax. But if you order

that same item online, sometimes no tax is collected at all. This means our local businesses are put at a disadvantage, and the City loses out on important revenue. By passing the use tax, Hallsville will be able to collect the same revenue on online purchases that it does on purchases made in town—without raising the existing sales tax rate.

Where will the money go?

All funds collected through the use tax will go right back into the community, helping with:

Road improvements – safer, smoother streets for drivers.

Public Works equipment upgrades - ensuring our crew has the tools they need to work efficiently and safely. Equipment and vehicle repairs - extending the life of city-owned equipment and vehicles while saving long-term costs.

Park upgrades - maintaining and enhancing spaces for families, children, and seniors to enjoy.


Public Safety - supporting the needs of our police to keep our community safe.


